At the St. Aelred's UCM Foundation we have hosted a series of talks entitled "My journey in Faith". This has come about as a result of our local Churches Together movement, which started some years ago with shared prayer services. This has led us to wish to know more about our neighbouring

denominations and faith groups and we have been privileged to hear many interesting and inspiring stories about individual Journeys in Faith, and how people have come to their understanding of their own position. We have heard from Anglican, Quaker, Catholic and other speakers, including Ministers and lay people. Most recently we had a talk by Julie Wainwright, Reader at our neighbouring Anglican Parish of St. Thomes, Osbaldwick. (This is the site of the burial of Mary Ward, founder of the Bar Convent community of nuns in the 17<sup>th</sup> Century).



She told us of her long journey from being the daughter of a Catholic mother and an Anglican father, with an Anglican vicar for a grandfather, to leaving both traditions as a young woman and then rediscovering her faith when she had a young family and was shown great support from her local Anglican community. Subsequently she trained as a Reader and can now take Funerals and conduct some services, although she does not aspire to becoming ordained as an Anglican Vicar. She has a busy role in her Parish assisting the Reverend Johannes Nobel. This was a most enlightening and interesting talk, and as with the other talks we have had in the series, it led us to reflect upon what we have in common as well as the differences between us and our neighbours. At the end of Mass Professor Bill Sheils spoke on behalf of the Parish to thank Father Bill for his wonderful example of service to the Parish and the community, with special mention to the setting up of Zoom when Covid struck in 2020 and how that supported the Parish and continues to play a very important role for the housebound to this day. He thanked Father Bill

for his inclusivity and ever welcoming presence in the Parish of St. Aelred's York and for the wide variety of activities he has been involved in. The evening finished with a letter from Bishop Emeritus John Crowley who had ordained Fr Bill twenty five years ago saying that he was sorry not to be able to attend the celebration.

After Mass there was a lavish supper in the Parish Centre and a special cake made by a parishioner that celebrated many sides of Fr. Bill's life among us.

Early the following morning Fr. Bill set off to walk Hadrian's Wall in aid of the Charity Papyrus, which works to prevent suicide among young people. Fr Bill was well supported by the parish & the amount raised from his Sponsored Walk was £5000.
